# **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT**

## OUTLINE

*The Motor Traffic (Amendment) Act (No 8) 1997* inserted a new Part 1B into the *Motor Traffic Act 1936* (the Act). This Part comprising sections 13A to 13Y, introduces a Competency Based Training and Assessment Scheme for learner drivers, administered by accredited driving instructors.

Under section 13H of the Act, the Registrar of Motor Vehicles may suspend or cancel the accreditation of an accredited driving instructor if he or she contravenes the Code of Practice.

The Registrar may approve a Code of Practice relating to accredited driving instructors pursuant to section 13U of the Act.

The Code of Practice is a disallowable instrument for the purposes of section 10 of the *Subordinate Laws Act 1989* (section 150N) and must be published in accordance with section 150P.

Under subsection 13W (1) of the Act, the Registrar of Motor Vehicles shall ensure that the Code is available for public inspection free of charge.

Subsection 13W (2) of the Act states that on application accompanied by the determined fee, the Registrar shall ensure that a copy of the Code or any part of it is made available to the applicant.
