EXPLANATORY STATEMENT INSTRUMENT NO. 39 \1996

APPOINTMENT OF ERIC JOHN MARTIN TO THE AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY HERITAGE COUNCIL

The Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991 ("the Land Act") governs the use of land in the Territory including the conservation of the Territory's heritage places.

Part III of the Land Act establishes the ACT Heritage Council (section 91), and members of Council are appointed by the Minister under section 97.

Members are appointed for a maximum period of three years, after which they may be re-appointed for a further maximum period of three years. A break of three years must then elapse before a member can be further reappointed.

This instrument appoints *Eric John Martin* to be a member of the Council for a period of 2 years commencing on 21 November 1995. A brief resume of Mr Martin's background is attached.

Section 7 of the Subordinate Laws Act 1989 prevents a subordinate law from having effect if it would prejudice the rights of a person existing at the date of notification, or if liabilities would be imposed on a person in respect of any act or omission before the date of notification. Neither circumstance will arise from the act of appointing the person named herein to the specified position(s)
