





Pursuant to Part X Division 5 of the ACT (Planning and Land Management) Act 1988 the Interim Territory Planning Authority has prepared a Draft Variation to the NCDC Policy for Yarralunla Section 40, Blocks 5 and 6 and Section 41, Blocks 4 and 6.

The aim of the Draft Variation to Policy for Yarralumla Section 40, Blocks 5 and 6 and Section 41, Blocks 4 and 6 is to seek public comment on a proposal to permit the development of the land for recreational facilities associated with the Hyatt Hotel which occupies the adjacent site

# AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY

Film Classification Act 1971

#### DETERMINATION

Under section 5 of the Film Classification Act 1971, I determine that:

- 1 Subject to clause 3, the markings in relation to a film that is advertised on a printed advertisement and is classified under the Film and Video Tape Classification Act 1984 of the State of New South Wales ('classified') as a'
  - (a) 'G' film shall comprise:
    - (i) a symbol, being the letter 'G', enclosed within. but not touched at any point by, a triangle ('the G symbol'), and
    - (ii) immediately to the right of the G symbol the words 'For General Exhibition';
  - (b) 'PG' film shall comprise:
    - (i) a symbol, being the letters 'PG' enclosed within, but not touched at any point by, a rectangle ('the PG symbol')'
    - (ii) immediately to the right of the PG symbol the words 'Parental Guidance recommended for persons under 15 years'; and
    - (iii) immediately beneath the words set out in the preceding paragraph, additional words that constitute consumer advice;
  - (c) 'M' film shall comprise:
    - a symbol, being the letter 'M', enclosed within, but not touched at any point by, a circle ('the M symbol');
    - (ii) immediately to the right of the M symbol the characters '15+' ('the M characters');
    - (iii) immediately to the right of the M characters the words 'Recommended for Mature Audiences 15 years and over', and
    - (iv) immediately beneath the words set out in the preceding paragraph, additional words that constitute consumer advice, and
  - (d) 'R' film shall comprise.

- (i) a symbol being the letter 'R' enclosed within, but not touched at any point by, a diamond ('the R symbol'),
- (ii) immediately to the right of the R symbol the characters '18+' ('the R characters');
- (iii) immediately to the right of the R characters the words 'Restricted to Adults 18 years and over'; and
- (iv) immediately beneath the words set out in the preceding paragraph, additional words that constitute consumer advice.
- The form and manner of the display of the markings referred to in clause 1 shall, with respect to
  - (a) the PG symbol, be:
    - on a One Sheet Poster, 108 points long and 81 points high;
    - (u) on a Day Bill Poster, 67 points long and 50 points high; and
    - (ii) on any other printed advertisement which is 150 square centimetres or more, 20 points long and 16 points high;
  - (b) any symbol referred to in clause 1, other than the PB symbol be:
    - (1) on a One Sheet Poster, 108 points high,
    - (11) on a Day Bill Poster, 67 points high;
    - (iii) on any other printed advertisement which is 150 square centimetres or more, 20 points high,
  - (c) any letter that forms part of a symbol referred to in clause 1, be.
    - (i) on a One Sheet Poster, 54 points high,
    - (ii) on a Day Bill Poster, 34 points high; and
    - (iii) on any other printed advertisement which is 150 square centimetres or more, 10 points high;
  - (d) each character in the M characters and the R characters, be
    - (1) on a One Sheet Poster, 36 points high;
    - (11) on a Day Bill Poster, 22 points high; and
    - (iii) on any other printed advertisement which is 150 square centimetres or more, 7 points high;
  - (e) each letter in a word, being a word other than consumer advice, be:
    - (1) on a One Sheet Poster, 27 points high;
    - (ii) on a Day Bill Poster, 17 points high; and
    - (iii) on any other printed advertisement which is 150 square centimetres or more, 6 points high,
  - (f) each letter in a word, being consumer advice, be.
    - (1) on a One Sheet Poster, 22 points high;
    - (ii) on a Day Bill Poster, 14 points high; and
    - (iii) on any other printed advertisement which is 150 square centimetres or more, 6 points high,
- 3 In a printed advertisement which is less than 150 square centimetres and which relates to a classified film:
  - (a) the markings shall be
    - (i) if the film is classified as a G, PG or M film—the G. PG or M symbol respectively, or
    - (ii) if the film is classified as an R film—the R symbol and immediately to the right of that symbol the R characters; and
  - (b) the form and manner of display of those markings shall be such that the symbol and characters (if any) shall be not less than half the height of the general letter size in the main title of the film included in the advertisement.
- 4. In a trailer film which relates to a classified film.
  - (a) the markings shall be as set out in clause 3,
  - (b) the markings are to be displayed for a period of 5

- seconds as a projected image that accompanies the trailer; and
- (c) the symbol that is, or forms part of, the marking is to occupy 5 per centum of the area of the projected image.
- Notwithstanding any other clause, the form and manner of display of markings shall be such that:
  - (a) they are as close as practicable to the title of the film; and
  - (b) their typeface and colours are prominent and easily distinguishable from any other matter with which they are displayed.
- 6 In this determination, 'consumer advice' means words (if any) described as consumer advice in the Chief Censor's notice of the decision which classified the film.
- 7 A requirement in this determination that a matter or thing be a prescribed measurement will be satisfied if the matter or thing exceeds that measurement
