Housing Assistance Act 1987

#### VARIATION

Under section 12 of the Housing Assistance Act 1987, I vary the Scheme for Providing or Assisting in Providing Dwelling Houses made under the Housing Ordinance 1928, and being a program in force under the Act by virtue of section 24 of the Act, as published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette No. S 13 on 21 January 1986 as follows.

- 1. By omitting clause 22 and substituting the following:
  - '22 (1) Applicants eligible for assistance under this scheme shall be recorded in the following order of priority and granted assistance in that order.

First, Category A:

- applicants responsible for housing dependants; and
- (ii) applicants who have been recorded as Category B applicants for a continuous period of at least twelve months.
  - Secondly, Category B. All other applicants.
- (2) Notwithstanding subclause (1), the Commissioner may grant assistance to an eligible person who is experiencing hardship including hardship caused by unemployment, reduction in income or relations in the household.'
