


DIVISION of BANKS






DIVISION of GORDON

Motor Omnibus Services Act 1955

DETERMINATION NO 10 OF 1989

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Determination:

- (a) Revokes and replaces the Motor Omnibus Services Determination No 33 of 1988 made under section 4 of the Motor Omnibus Services Act 1955,
- (b) corrects an editorial error in that Determination where the heading 'Quarterly Tickets' was misplaced half way through clause 5, and now correctly appears in this Determination immediately above clause 6,
- (c) extends the entitlement to free travel on ACTION buses of ex-employees who have retired after more than twenty years service with the Canberra motor omnibus service which was provided by that Determination to the spouses of those ex-employees, and
- (d) also extends the entitlement to free travel to retired employees with more than twenty years service in the Canberra Bus Service who in 1977 transferred within the Commonwealth administration from the then Department of the Capital Territory to the then Department of Administrative Services as motor drivers in the Ministerial and Passenger Car Fleet. (At that time responsibility for the Fleet was transferred from the Department of the Capital Territory to the Department of Administrative Services)

Motor Omnibus Services Act 1955

DETERMINATION OF CHARGES

DETERMINATION NO 10 OF 1989

Under section 4 of the *Motor Omnibus Services Act 1955*, I revoke the determination notice of which was published in the Commonwealth *Gazette* No S243 on 24 August 1988 I determine that the charges Commonwealth for the purposes of the Act shall be in accordance with the Schedule. Interpretation

- (1) In this Determination, unless the contrary intention appears.
- 'Blind person' means a person who is totally or partially blind
- 'Concession-group member' means
- (a) a person who is
 - (1) a dependent spouse;
 - (11) an immigrant student,
 - (111) a school student;
 - (iv) a special beneficiary;
 - (v) a student nurse;
 - (vi) a tertiary student, or
 - (vii) a sickness beneficiary,

and, who is in possession of and, who produces to the driver or an inspector, written evidence, of a kind approved by the Director, identifying the person as such a person, and

- (b) a person who is a child,
- 'Dependent spouse' means the dependent spouse of a person to whom there is being paid a benefit under Part VII of the Social Security Act 1947 of the Commonwealth;
- 'Driver' means the driver of an omnibus,
- 'Ex-employee' means a person who
- (a) has or was retired from employment by the Commonwealth
