REMAND CENTRES ACT 1976

DECLARATION OF TEMPORARY REMAND CENTRE

Pursuant to Section 5(1) of the Remand Centres Act 1976 ("the Act"), the Administrator appointed pursuant to Section 6(1) of the Remand Centres Act 1976 has informed me that:

- (a) the number of detainees in the remand centre declared by instrument under Section 4 of the Remand Cerntres Act and published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette No. S169 of 27 September 1976 ("the Centre") is likely to be greater than the number that can be held conveniently in the centre; and
- (b) it is not convenient to transfer some detainees to another institution, within or outside the Territory.

Therefore, under Section 5(5) of the Act I, MAURICE REASEXTON, extend for 12 months the Declaration of a Temporary Remand Centre published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette No. S276 of 15 September 1988 relating to the area of land on which is located that portion of the Belconnen Police Station known as Cells 1,2,3,4,5 and 6 and the washroom and exercise yard (male) as applicable and Cells 7 and 8 and the washroom and exercise yard (female) as applicable being part of Section 23 Belconnen.

MILK AUTHORITY ORDINANCE 1971

The Milk Authority of the Australian Capital Territory in pursuance of Section 16A of the Milk Authority Ordinance 1971, hereby fixes and declares:

- This notice takes effect on the fourth day of September 1989.
- The Gazette Notice published pursuant to the Milk Authority Ordinance 1971 dated the twenty-seventh day of June 1989 and notified in the ACT Gazette on the thirtieth day of June 1989 is amended.
- 3. Pursuant to Section 16A (1) of the Milk Authority Ordinance 1971:
 - (a) the maximum price at which packaged milk (homogenised and pasteurised or pasteurised, including flavoured milk as specified) may be sold by retail is fixed at and declared to be:
