

NO 55 OF 1990

DETERMINATION:

The Australian Capital Territory Electricity and Water Authority (ACTEW) in pursuance of Section 48 of the Electricity and Water Act 1988, makes the following determination fixing the charges that are to be payable to ACTEW for, or in connection with the supply of electricity, with effect from 1 September 1990.

1. GENERAL

- 1.1 This Determination prescribes the monetary rates of charges that are payable to ACTEW for or in connection with the supply of electricity to consumers.
- 1.2 Meter readings (other than readings taken at the termination of supply) shall be taken to the nearest ten kilowatt hours.

GOVERNMENT NOTICES COMMUNICATION

- 1.3 The charge applicable for supply to each installation shall be in accordance with the following classification of premises, places and purposes:
 - 1.3.1 Domestic Charge shall be applicable to installations at dwellings including dwellings subsidiarily used for medical or dental practice; residential convents and charitable homes; boarding schools; churches used for public worship; and public light and power in these premises;
 - 1.3.2 Farm Charge shall be applicable to installations at premises or properties used mainly for primary production;
 - 1.3.3 Community Services Charge shall be applicable to installations at premises or properties which are used wholly or principally for community benefit and which are owned or operated by non-profit organisations. Organisations covered by this rate are Scout and Guide Halls; Community Halls and Church Halls used by non-profit organisations; centres for the use of the aged, infirm, destitute or physically handicapped; but not including educational institutions and hospitals;
 - 1.3.4 General Charge shall be applicable to installations not included in the preceding subparagraphs, "Domestic Charge", "Farm Charge" and "Community Services Charge", provided that special rates shall be applicable to particular premises and appliances as hereinafter provided, and for special apparatus or equipment wherever located;
 - 1.3.5 **Off-Peak Charge 1** (the "New Age" charge) shall be applicable to appropriately designed, sized and installed water heater storage units with 2 elements in residential dwellings.
 - 1.3.5.1 Units must be approved, permanently installed and for which a test certificate has been issued indicating compliance with Australian Standard 1056; with twin elements; operation via the main element is for a minimum of 6 hours and a maximum of 8 hours within any one day, between 2200 hours (10.00 pm) and 0700 hours (7.00 am). The actual settings on the time switch will be nominated by ACTEW. Times referred to are in Australian Eastern Standard Time:

- 1.3.5.2 Rated delivery shall be not less than 250 litres, but units shall be sized according to the table below to match the house size:
- 1.3.5.3 The main lower element shall be normally energised at the prescribed off-peak hours whereas the upper booster element will take supply only when the rising level of cold inlet water activates its thermostat;
- 1.3.5.4 Elements must be interlocked, i.e., not simultaneous operation. Supply to the top booster element will be available at the same charge during the remaining hours of the day if required;
- 1.3.5.5 This charge applies to single unit residential premises i.e., separately metered, self-contained private dwellings supplied at Domestic Charge;
- 1.3.5.6 Minimum Storage of Water Heaters:

- 1.3.6 Off-Peak Charge 2 (the normal off-peak charge) shall be applicable to heat storage devices which absorb their major energy during off-peak times, but which may be boosted at normal charge at other times:
 - 1.3.6.1 Water heating storage units not qualifying for the Off-Peak Charge 1 (the New Age Charge) in residential dwellings. Heaters may have main or main and booster elements but any top booster element will have to be

connected to the principal charge; water heating storage units must be permanently installed not less than 160 litre rated delivery, for which a test certificate has been issued indicating compliance with Australian Standard 1056;
