



#### Preliminary Assessment Report: Environmental Factors

ACT Public Works and Services Group has prepared on behalf of the proponent, Department of Environment Land and Planning, Land Development Branch, a Preliminary Assessment Report on Environmental factors relating to the proposed deepening of the creek waterway under the two bridges located on (1) William Slim Drive Giralang, McKellar and (2) Baldwin Drive Giralang.

#### The Report outlines:

- description of the environment conditions;
- description of the region surrounding the project site;
- current land use policy and lease conditions of the site;
- potential impact of the project on the physical, human and non—human environment;
- potentially beneficial impacts;
- nature of the impacts and their significance;
- feasible attematives and their significance; and
- Specific environmental safeguards and standards to be adopted.

The purpose of the Report is to invite public comment on the Preliminary Assessment in order to ensure that the proposed work satisfies community concerns.
