The ACT Planning Authority intends to revise the planning proposal for the West Belconnen land development. The revised proposal will delete Areas A1, A2 and D from the proposed land development. This accords with ACT Government policy.

Another modification to the initial proposal will be the provision of a buffer, a minimum 40 metres in width, between Area C and the existing residential areas of Charnwood and Fraser. The buffer between Area B and MacGregor is not proposed to be changed. The estimated maximum population of the land development will be 9,000 people in up to 3,100 dwellings.

This revised proposal was not considered as an optional form of development in the draft environmental impact statement for which comments closed on February 20 this year. The Authority is revising the environmental impact statement to reflect these changes and invites comments from interested people on the environmental impacts of the revised proposal prior to submitting the statement to the Environment Minister.

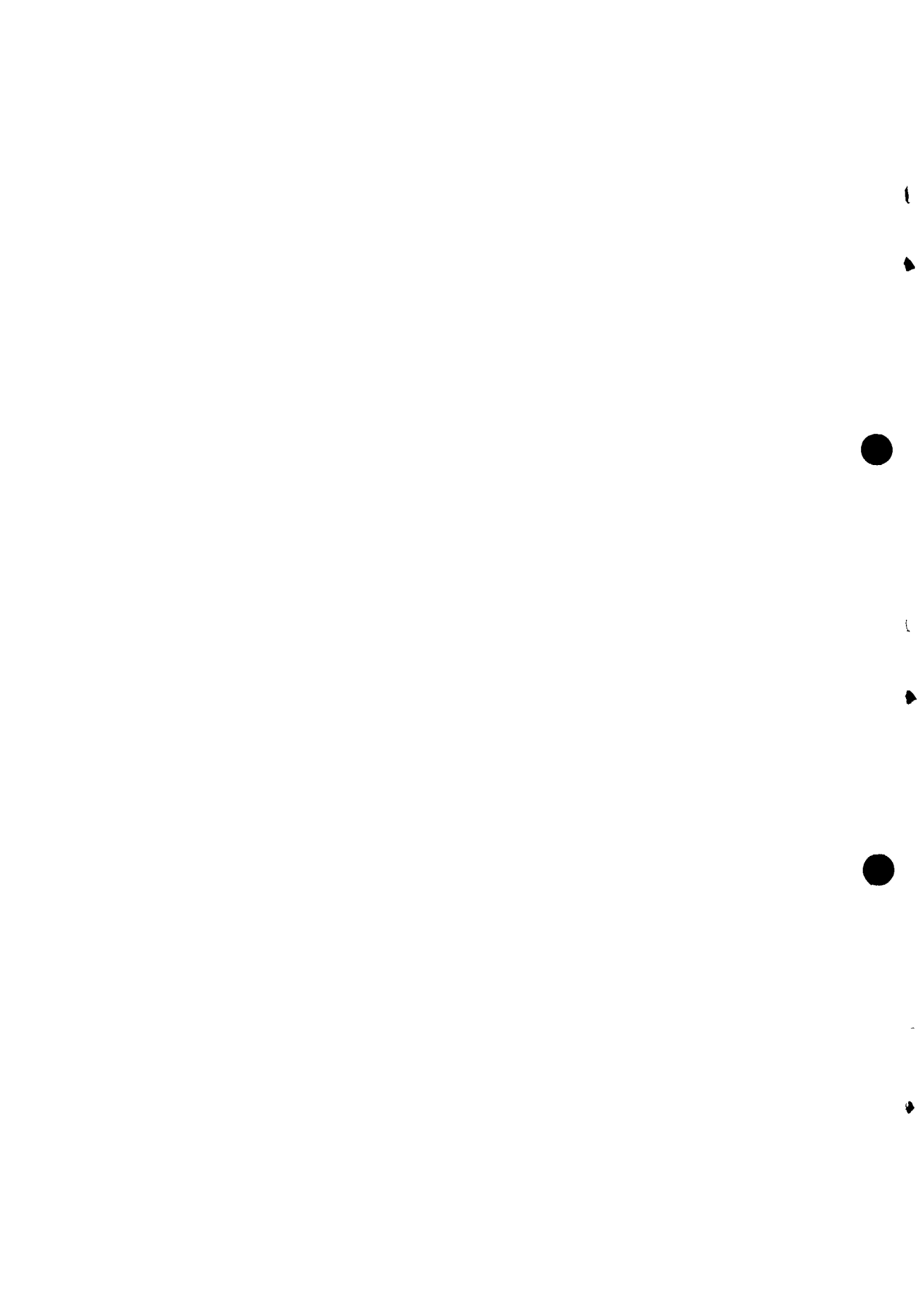
