REMUNERATION AND ALLOWANCES FOR APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE LIQUOR LICENSING BOARD

The Liquor Licensing Board is established pursuant to section 12A of the Liquor Act 1975 (the Act).

The functions of the Board are:

- (a) to consider and determine applications or other matters referred to it under the Act;
- (b) to conduct inquiries, including hearings, in relation to applications or other matters referred to it under the Act;
- (c) to advise the Minister, as required, on matters of policy and administration; and
- (d) to perform such other functions and duties as are conferred on it by or under the Act or another Act.

Under section 12F of the Act the appointed members of the Liquor Licensing Board are entitled to remuneration and allowances at a rate determined by the responsible Minister.

On 9 March 1991 the former Attorney General determined pursuant to the Remuneration Tribunal, Fees and Allowances - Offices Not Specified Determination, the Category 2 daily fee be paid to members of the Liquor Licensing Board.

In Determination Number 22 of 1991 the Remuneration Tribunal determined new daily fees for Offices Not Specified, Category 2 to take effect from 15 August 1991.

This instrument gives effect to the new daily fees in this category and the described travelling allowance to be paid to members of the Board.
