
**PUBLIC ROADS ACT 1902 OF THE STATE OF NEW SOUTH WALES

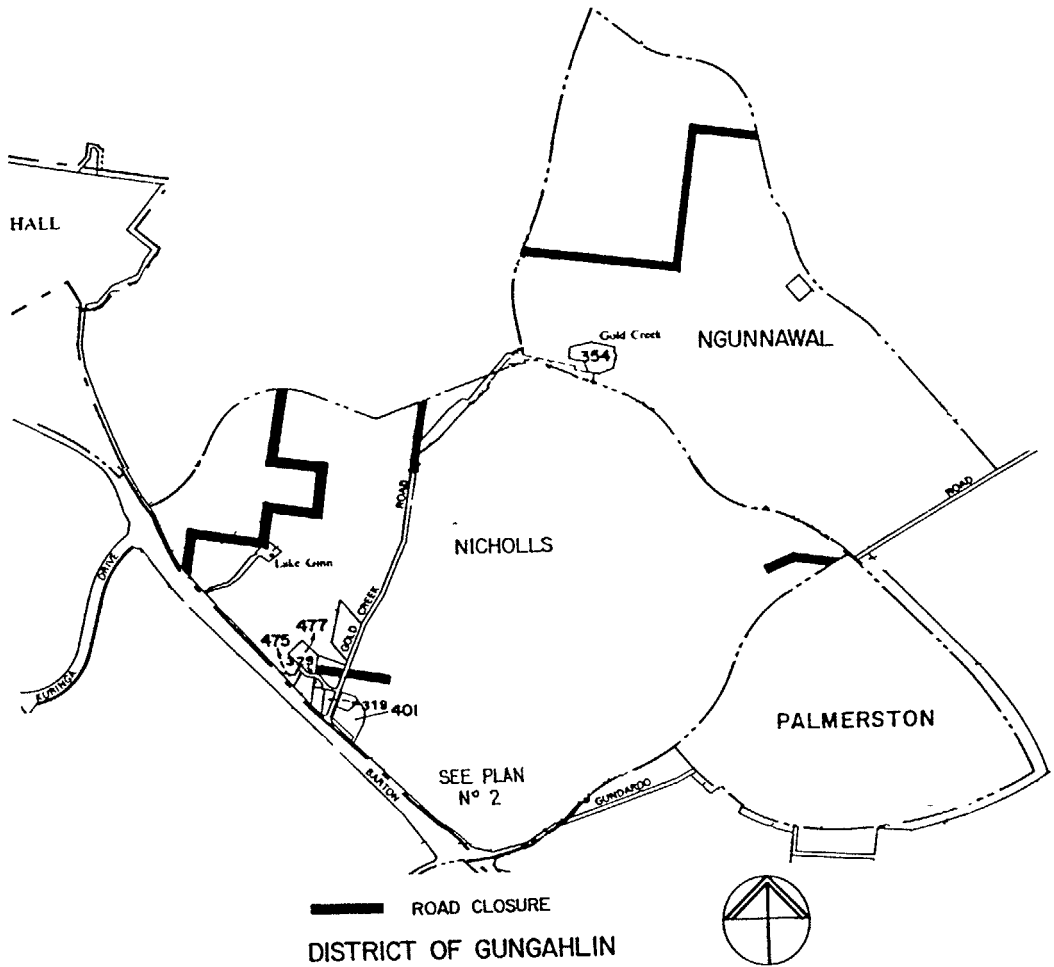

All that land in the Australian Capital Territory, shown in thick black line on the plans annexed hereto:

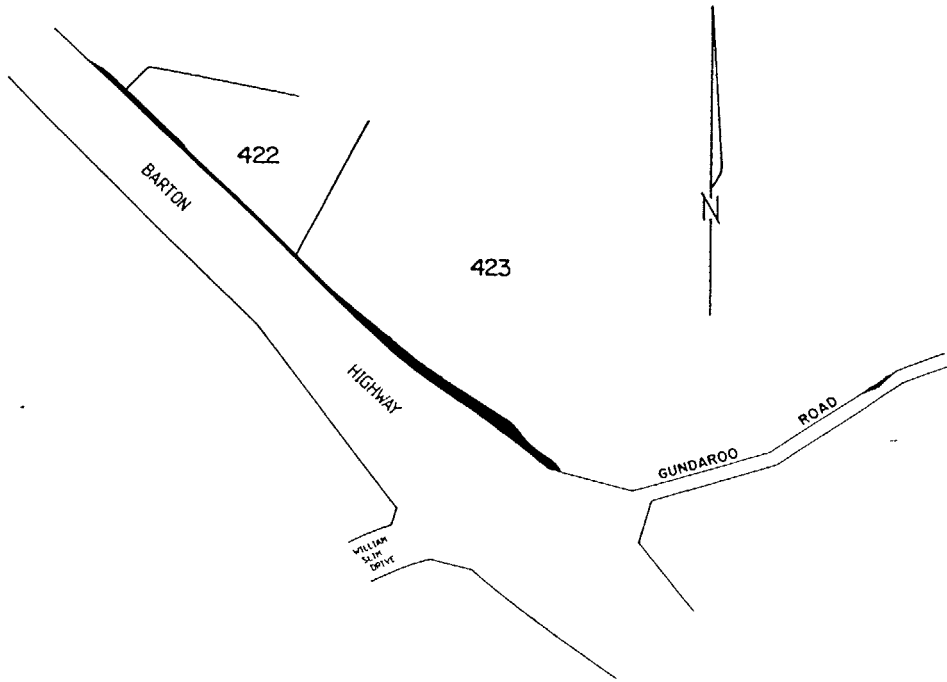
Plan No. 1: Old New South Wales crown road reserves within the Divisions of Nicholls and Ngunnawal in the District of Gungahlin.
