DIVISION OF NGUNNAWAL: NOTABLE ABORIGINALS AND WORDS

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
WANGANEEN AVENUE	Kenneth Wanganeen (-d1990)	Aborigine, Public Servant, Academic. He completed a Bachelor of Arts degree with honours at Flinders University and between 1973 and 1980 worked for the Public Service Board and the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet. In 1978-79 he was a Harkness Fellow with the Commonwealth Fund of New York. He studied at the University of Northern Arizona and worked in the Bureau of Indian Affairs. In 1980 he joined the Department of Aboriginal Affairs and was promoted to Assistant Secretary in 1983. He served on the Aboriginal Development Commission and often represented Australia at the UN and at other international forums. In 1989 he left the Public Service and set up his own management consultancy firm. He was committed to bringing Aborigines and White Australians together in a constructive way. Delegate's Initials



STREET NOMENCLATURE

DIVISION OF NGUNNAWAL: NOTABLE ABORIGINALS AND WORDS

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
WELLINGTON STREET	(C.1828-)	Aboriginal Leader in the A.C.T. area. Wellington whose tribal name was Moridjergong was said to be "King of the Murrumbidgee blacks". He frequented the Yarralumla area and was a good stockman. He wore a brass breast-plate and was a very tall, imposing figure. He was a friend of Captain Murray of Yarralumla.
BIRRIKAI SQUARE		Ngunnawal word meaning "to Laugh".
DYARA CLOSE		Ngunnawal word meaning "Bowerbird".
GALU PLACE		Ngunnawal word meaning "Crane".
WALGA PLACE		Ngunnawal word meaning "Hawk".
WIRRIA CIRCUIT		Ngunnawal word meaning "Tree Goanna".
BURU CLOSE		Ngunnawal word meaning "Kangaroo".



BAMIR SQUARE	Ngunnawal word meaning "Long".
GURRANG AVENUE	Ngunnawal word meaning "Clouds".
