Effect of inclusion in the interim Heritage Objects Register

Pursuant to section 8 of the *Heritage Objects Act 1991*, the interim Heritage Objects Register has effect as if it were the Heritage Objects Register during the defined period

The "defined period" is a period not exceeding one year that commences on the day of the publication of this notice and which terminates at the expiration of:

- the day before the date of effect of the Heritage Objects Register or variation; or
- the day before the date the refusal of approval is notified for entry in the Heritage Objects Register ;

During the defined period the Territory, the Executive, or a Minister shall not do any act, or approve the doing of any act, that would be inconsistent with the interim Heritage Objects Register as if it were the Heritage Objects Register.

Under section 8 (3) the above does not apply in relation to the doing of any act, or the approval of the doing of any act, by the Territory, the Executive or a Minister where there is no prudent and feasible alternative and all prudent and feasible measures to comply with any requirements specified in the interim or Heritage Objects Register for the conservation of the heritage significance of the object are taken or to be taken in doing that act.
