

All other copy is to be confined within the margins of: 20mm from the top and bottom and 25mm from left and right hand sides of the page. The successful applicant must be suitably qualified, and would deliver accredited training for new custodial officers, as well as supplementary training for existing officers.

PERIODIC DETENTION CENTRE: The curriculum for periodic Detention Centre will be based on the Adult Custodial Care Certificate The successful applicant will be required to develop six additional training modules. Training against this curriculum is not part of the contract.

WILLIAM SLIM INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS

PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT REPORT

ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS

R.A. Young & Associates has prepared on behalf of the proponent Construction & Maintenance Management Services a Preliminary Assessment report on the environmental factors relating to the proposed intersection improvements at the intersections of Baldwin Drive, Owen-Dixon Drive, and Chuculba Crescent with William Slim Drive.

The report outlines:
