NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

Pursuant to section 22(1)(c) of the *Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991*, (the Land Act), the Planning and Land Management Group of the Department of Urban Services has withdrawn draft Variation No 82 to the Territory Plan, which proposed Area Specific Policies B11 and B12 in North Canberra and Appendix III 3 Urban Housing Code

This draft Variation was released for public comment by notice in Special Gazette Number S125 of 16 May 1997

The interim effect of the draft Variation, under section 9 of the Land Act, ceased on 15 May 1998

Please note that draft Variation No 82 has been replaced by draft Variation No 109 which has been released for public comment with interim effect, under section 9 of the Land Act, from 15 May 1998

PROPOSED AREA SPECIFIC POLICIES B11 AND B12 IN NORTH CANBERRA
AND APPENDIX III 3 URBAN HOUSING CODE

A draft Variation to the Territory Plan concerning the Proposed Area Specific Policies B11 and B12 in North Canberra and Appendix III 3 Urban Housing Code, has been prepared by the Planning and Land Management Group (PALM) of the Department of Urban Services (incorporating the functions of the ACT Planning Authority)

Draft Variation No 109 replaces draft Variation No 82, which has been withdrawn with effect from 15 May 1998

The draft Variation proposes dividing selected B1 areas in North Canberra excluding those immediately adjacent to Northbourne Avenue and Ainslie Avenue into two distinct Area Specific Policies identified as the B11 Urban Housing area and the B12 Urban Housing area. This proposal is a continuation of the general concept originally proposed in draft Variation No 82. However a number of specific refinements have been incorporated to respond to issues raised during the original consultation on draft Variation No 82 and in subsequent meetings with resident group representatives.

The area covered by the draft Variation is shown on the map below

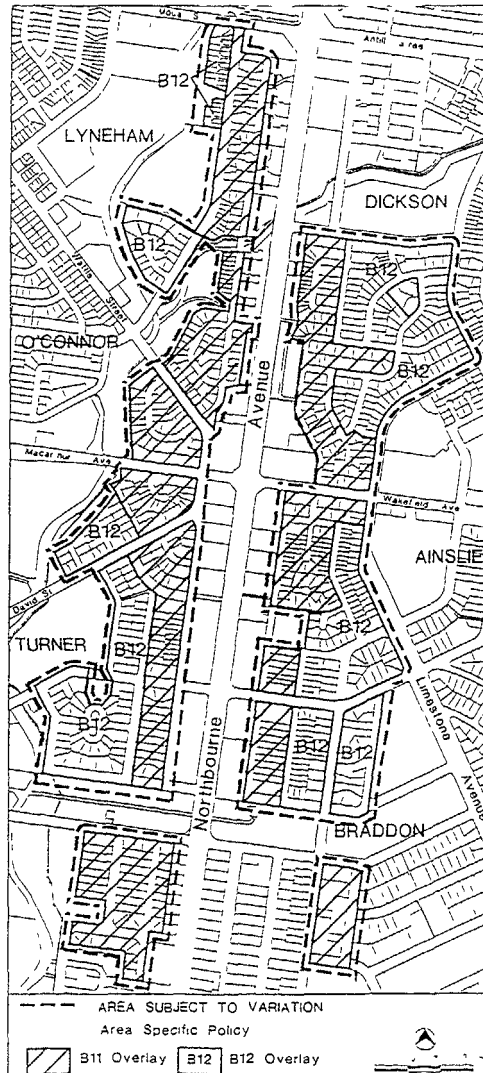


Figure 1 VARIATION TO THE TERRITORY PLAN MAP

This draft Variation, provided it is not deferred, has interim effect until 14 May 1999, or for the "defined period", whichever is the shorter. The "defined period" commences on Friday 15 May 1998 and continues until the draft Variation, or the corresponding Plan Variation

comes into effect or

is rejected by the Legislative Assembly, or

is withdrawn

While the draft Variation has interim effect the Territory, the Executive, a Minister or a Territory Authority shall not do or approve, any act which would be inconsistent with the Territory Plan or the Plan if it was varied in accordance with this draft Variation

Section 11 of the *Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991* (the Land Act), concerning the Heritage Places Register does not apply to this draft Variation
