
### AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY (SELF-GOVERNMENT) ACT 1988

## AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY

## ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS 2000

I, Gary Humphries, Chief Minister for the Australian Capital Territory, make the following administrative arrangements under section 43 of the *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988* (Cwlth) and sections 13 and 14 of the *Public Sector Management Act 1994*.

**1 Name of arrangements**

These administrative arrangements are the *Administrative Arrangements 2000*.

**2 Commencement**

These arrangements commence on the day they are notified in the Gazette.

**3 Definitions**

In these arrangements:

**Public Sector Management Act** means the *Public Sector Management Act 1994*.

**Self-Government Act** means the *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988* (Cwlth).

**4 Ministerial portfolios—allocation of powers (Self-Government Act, s 43 (1))**

For subsection 43 (1) of the Self-Government Act, a Minister mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule is allocated responsibility for the following matters relating to the powers of the Executive:

- (a) governing the Territory in relation to the matters mentioned in column 2 opposite the reference to the Minister;
- (b) executing and maintaining the Territory enactments in column 3 opposite the reference to the Minister and the subordinate laws under those enactments;
- (c) exercising the powers of the Executive under the Commonwealth laws mentioned in column 3 opposite the reference to the Minister;
- (d) exercising prerogatives of the Crown for the matters mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).

**5 Authorisation of Ministers to act on each others behalf (Self-Government Act, s 43 (2))**

For subsection 43 (2) of the Self-Government Act, any Minister is authorised to act on the Chief Minister's behalf or on behalf of another Minister.

**6 Constitution of administrative units (Public Sector Management Act, s 13)**

For section 13 of the Public Sector Management Act—

- (a) the administrative units in column 4 of the Schedule are established or continued in existence, as the case requires; and
- (b) a Chief Executive in column 5 is placed in control of the administrative unit or units in column 4 opposite the reference to the Chief Executive.

**7 Ministerial functions and functions of administrative units (Public Sector Management Act, s 14)**

For section 14 of the Public Sector Management Act—

- (a) a Minister in column 1 of the Schedule is allocated responsibility for the administrative unit or units in column 4 opposite the reference to the Minister; and
- (b) an administrative unit in column 4 of the Schedule is allocated responsibility for—
  - (i) the matters in column 2 opposite the reference to the unit; and
  - (ii) the Territory enactments in column 3 opposite the reference to the unit; and
  - (iii) powers of the Executive under Commonwealth laws in column 3 opposite the reference to the unit; and
  - (iv) the prerogatives of the Crown for the matters in column 3 opposite the reference to the unit.

**8 Revocation of existing administrative arrangements**

All other administrative arrangements in force are revoked.
