Regulations on Recycling and Garbage 2003

Notifiable Instrument NI 2003— 138

made under the *Waste Minimisation Act 2001* 26(1) (The regulations may make provision in relation to the storage, collection or disposal of waste) and the *Waste Minimisation Regulations 2001* 6(1) (Segregation of garbage)

WASTE MINIMISATION ACT 2001

DIRECTION UNDER SUBSECTION 26 (1)

THE ACT EXECUTIVE HEREBY GIVES THE FOLLOWING DIRECTION under subsection 26(1) of the *Waste Minimisation Act 2001* and Regulation 6 of the *Waste Minimisation Regulations 2001* in relation to the type of materials allowed in the Territory provided recycling and garbage bins and hoppers from 28 April 2003:

Recycling Bin/Hoppers

Only put rigid plastic containers, paper and cardboard, glass bottles and jars, steel cans, aluminium cans, trays and foil, liquid paperboard cartons in the yellow lidded recycling bin or hopper.

Plastic bags or film plastics, disposable nappies, motor oil, syringes, crockery, drinking glasses, light globes, window or mirror glass, car parts, garbage, kitchen and food scraps, clothes, garden waste, or non-recyclable materials should not be put into the recycling bin or hopper.

Garbage Bins/Hoppers

Only put garbage in the residential bin/hopper.

Garbage does not include regulated wastes (*Environmental Protection Act 1997*, schedule 1, clause 1A), garden waste, rocks, soil, hot ashes, commercial waste, industrial waste, building waste, dead animals, solvents, paint or oil. Contravention of the regulation attracts a penalty of up to \$500.
