Draft variation No. 224 to the Territory Plan has been prepared by the ACT Planning and Land Authority in accordance with Section 19 of the *Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991* (the Act).

The draft plan variation proposes to replace the current Entertainment Accommodation and Leisure Land Use Policy over Block 1 Section 54 Lyneham with a Residential Land Use Policy and including a B12 area specific policy.

Copies of written comments received, and any response from the National Capital Authority, will be made available for public inspection at the ACTPLA Customer Service Centre, 16 Challis Street, Dickson, during normal office hours for a period of 15 business days after the closing date for comments.

Under section 9 of the Act this draft plan variation has interim effect until 30 January 2005 or earlier if:

- the draft variation comes into effect; or
- the approved plan variation is rejected by the Legislative Assembly; or
- the draft variation is withdrawn.

Interim effect means that the provisions of the draft plan variation are to be treated as though they were actually part of the Territory Plan. Where there is an inconsistency between a provision of the draft plan variation and a comparable provision in the Territory Plan, the more onerous provision shall apply. In this case, residential development is not permissible during the period of interim effect because such use is prohibited under the current Entertainment Accommodation and Leisure Land Use Policy.

Section 11 of the Act does not apply because the variation does not vary the heritage places register.
