Land (Planning and Environment) (Draft Variation No 229) Notice 2004

Supportive Housing & Adaptable Housing Provisions

Notifiable instrument NI2004—247

made under the

***Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991*, section 19(1)**
(Public Consultation - Notification)

Draft variation No.229 to the Territory Plan has been prepared by the ACT Planning and Land Authority in accordance with section 19 of the *Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991* (the Act).

The draft plan variation proposes to:

- Introduce a new definition of “supportive housing”;
- prohibit unit titling of supportive housing development within the community facility land use policy areas;
- include adaptable housing provisions in several residential areas and all commercial areas; and
- make minor procedural changes to referencing and the Entertainment Accommodation and Leisure land use schedule.

Copies of written comments received, and any response from the National Capital Authority, will be made available for public inspection at the ACTPLA Customer Service Centre, 16 Challis Street, Dickson, during normal office hours for a period of 15 business days after the closing date for comments.

Section 9 of the Act applies to the draft variation, which has interim effect for a maximum period of 1 year commencing on 23 July 2004 and ending on 22 July 2005. During this period, or a period commencing on 23 July 2004 and terminating at the expiration of the day before:

- the date the draft variation comes into effect;
- the date the corresponding plan variation is rejected by the Legislative Assembly; or
- the date the draft variation, or the corresponding plan variation, is withdrawn under section 22(1)(c), section 27(a) or section 30A(3)(b) of the Act;

whichever is shorter, the Territory, the Executive, the Minister or a Territory Authority shall not do any act, or approve the doing of any act that –

- (a) would be inconsistent with the Territory Plan, if it were varied in accordance with the draft variation; or
- (b) is inconsistent with the Territory Plan.

Section 11 of the Act does not apply because the draft variation does not vary the heritage places register.
