Land (Planning and Environment) (Draft Variation No 260) (Garran, Griffith, Hackett and Yarralumla) Notice 2006

Notifiable instrument NI2006—119

made under the

***Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991*, section 19(1) (Public Consultation - Notification)**

Draft variation No. 260 to the Territory Plan has been prepared by the ACT Planning and Land Authority in accordance with section 19 of the *Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991* (the Act).

The draft plan variation proposes to change the A10 Residential Core Areas for the suburbs of Garran, Griffith, Hackett and Yarralumla. The draft plan variation also proposes to amend the precinct boundaries and introduce additional land use restrictions and controls for Section 22 within the Kingston Group Centre.

Copies of written comments received, and any response from the National Capital Authority, will be made available for public inspection at the ACT Planning and Land Authority Customer Service Centre, 16 Challis Street, Dickson, during normal office hours for a period of 15 business days after the closing date for comments.

Section 9 of the Act applies to the draft variation, which has interim effect for a maximum period of 1 year commencing on 6 April 2006 and ending on 5 April 2007. During this period, or a period commencing on 6 April 2006 and terminating at the expiration of the day before:

- the date the draft variation comes into effect;
- the date the corresponding plan variation is rejected by the Legislative Assembly; or
- the date the draft variation, or the corresponding plan variation, is withdrawn under section 22(1)(c), section 27(a) or section 30A(3)(b) of the Act;

whichever is shorter, the Territory, the Executive, the Minister or a Territory Authority shall not do any act, or approve the doing of any act that –

- (a) would be inconsistent with the Territory Plan, if it were varied in accordance with the draft variation; or
- (b) is inconsistent with the Territory Plan.
