- the date the Draft Variation comes into effect;
- the date the corresponding plan variation is rejected by the Legislative Assembly; or
- the date the Draft Variation, or the corresponding plan variation, is withdrawn under section 22(1)(c), section 27(a) or section 30A(3)(b) of the Act:

whichever is shorter, the Territory, the Executive, the Minister or a Territory Authority shall not do any act, or approve the doing of any act that –

- (a) would be inconsistent with the Territory Plan, if it were varied in accordance with the draft variation; or
- (b) is inconsistent with the Territory Plan.
