# Occupational Health and Safety (Pallet Trucks) Exemption 2009

# Notifiable Instrument NI2009 — 192

made under the:

Occupational Health and Safety (Certification of Plant Users and Operators) Regulation 2000 - section 32 (Exemptions)

## 1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the Occupational Health and Safety (Pallet Trucks) Exemption 2009.

#### 2 Commencement

This instrument commences on the day after notification.

## 3 Exemption

Persons operating a pallet truck of a type identified in this instrument are exempt from the operation of section 25 of the *Occupational Health and Safety (Certification of Plant Users and Operators) Regulation 2000* only to the extent that those persons are not required to hold a certificate of competency for the operation of a forklift truck.

# 4 Type of Pallet Truck

The types of pallet trucks that this instrument applies to are:

- 1. Pallet trucks which are pedestrian operated, where the operator is intended to control the truck whilst not riding on the truck.
- 2. Pallet trucks capable of providing a maximum lift not exceeding 225 millimetres.

## 5 Conditions

This exemption does not waive or reduce the employer's obligation under the *Occupational Health and Safety Act 1989* to provide employees with the information, instruction, training and supervision necessary to enable them to perform their work in a manner that is safe and without risk to their health.

The employer must develop a safe method of work which has regard to any risk assessment developed or approved by the manufacturer in respect of the operation of this type of plant.
