1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Utilities (Annual Licence Fees Determination 2013-14) Notice 2013.*

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on the day after it is notified.

3 Revocation of 2012-13 Annual Licence Fee Determination

This instrument revokes the *Utilities (Annual Licence Fees Determination) Notice 2012* (NI2012-561).

4 Determination of licence fees

The Independent Competition and Regulatory Commission (the Commission) gives notice that the Commission has determined the annual licence fees payable by licensed utilities under the *Utilities Act 2000* for the year ending on 30 June 2014, as set out in the attached schedule (tables 1 to 3).

Tables 1 sets out the licence fees for 2013-14 payable by East Australian Pipeline Limited (licensed to supply gas transmission services) and ACTEW Corporation Limited (licensed to supply water and sewerage services).

Table 2 sets out the total estimated regulatory costs for the three ACT government agencies, namely the Commission, the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal, and the Environment and Sustainable Development Directorate.

Table 3 sets out the derivation of the licence fees payable including the adjustment for differences between the total estimated regulatory costs for 2012-13 and the total actual regulatory costs for 2012-13.

In determining the licence fee payable by each utility, the Commission had regard to:

- What it considered the utilities should make as a reasonable contribution towards the costs incurred or expected to be incurred by the three agencies;
- the amount of the fee and the way it is worked out; and
- the relative scope and nature of the services provided by all utilities.

Unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Commission, determined fees, shown in table 1, are payable by the licensee to the Commission in three (3) equal instalments to be paid by:

- 30 November 2013
- 31 January 2014
- 31 March 2014

5 Public access to determination of annual licence fees

Copies of the Commission's determination of annual licence fees are available for inspection by members of the public:
