SCHEDULE

<u>Cashless Gaming System Operational Requirements - Ticket In Ticket Out</u>

A Ticket In Ticket Out Cashless Gaming System must operate in accordance with the following requirements:

- 1. It must function as part of an 'Aristocrat System 7000', an 'IGT Systems Club' or 'Bally iVista CEM' management system.
- 2. A gaming machine ticket must display the following:
 - (a) information regarding the venue where the ticket was printed (eg. the licensee's trading name);
 - (b) a unique identification number for each ticket;
 - (c) the value of the ticket's gaming credits in dollars and cents;
 - (d) the date and time the ticket was printed; and
 - (e) at least one of the following harm minimisation messages or a message that is materially the same and approved by the ACT Gambling and Racing Commission:

3. The cashless gaming system must not allow a gaming machine to accept a gaming machine ticket valued at greater than \$800.
