Only TITO, Pre-commitment, U-spin promotion, trade promotion lottery, loyalty point management, player service requests, Voluntary Pre-Commitment and linking to cash redemption terminals functions are covered by this approval; and 2. Mad Multiplier, Power Coupons, Step and Win, Free Play Rebate, Stay and Play, Quick Draw, Cashless gaming, offline ticketing, offline gaming, Display Manager (DM) Tournaments, Dynamic Random Bonusing, Flex Rewards, Virtual Racing, Video Poker Bonusing, Power Paytable Progressive promotions, Power Strike Progressive promotions, Lucky Match Bonusing, and Community Gaming Events functions of the system are not part of this approval; and 3. The Loyalty Server must have a secure connection to a real-time backup facility to be located in a secure data centre; and 4. The configurable Promo-Spin wheel is not to be enabled (only the U-spin 20 or 30 segment wheel); and 5. Each prospective purchaser must be advised that it will need to ensure than any promotions or reward programs operated by the purchaser via the system’s promotional and reward facilities must meet all ACT legislative requirements, in particular the <i>Gambling and Racing Control (Code of Practice) Regulation 2002</i> and <i>Lotteries Act 1964</i>; and 6. Each prospective purchaser must be advised that pre-printed paper rolls that show the ACT harm minimisation message must be used in the ticket printer; and 7. The only promotion authorised for use with this Bally system is U-Spin. Trade Promotion Lottery permits must be obtained in relation to U-Spin promotions, prior to the commencement or advertising of the promotion; and 8. The venue’s Trade Promotion Lottery permit number must be displayed to players when the gaming machine is participating in a system supported Trade Promotion Lottery.
