Pursuant to Section 138AB of the *Planning and Development Act* 2007 and Section 60 of the *Heritage Act* 2004, the ACT Heritage Council advises that:



The proposal is unlikely to have a significant adverse environmental impact, subject to compliance with the conditions described below.

Background:

On 21 November 2018, an Environmental Significance Opinion (ESO) was sought from the ACT Heritage Council (the Council) on proposed Evoenergy maintenance works within existing electrical transmission lines, within the Districts of Belconnen and Woden.

Evoenergy is proposing to replace existing 132kV power lines, within approximately 15 kilometres of existing easements, using a trailer mounted cable pulling machine, which requires two large concrete blocks to be placed with it as an anchor. Access will be along existing access pathways. Work areas are approximately 10 metres squared, located on flat ground. No earthworks or vegetation removal is anticipated.

Review of the ACT Heritage Register identifies that three heritage places occur in the vicinity of proposed works, being two Aboriginal places (recorded as 'WB4' and 'CLB12 (B12)') and one natural heritage place (Kama Woodland/Grassland).

Planned maintenance works are unlikely to impact WB4 and CLB12 (B12), as both sites are not adjacent to existing towers and not located on access tracks.

Planned maintenance works are also unlikely to impact the heritage significance of the Kama Woodland/Grassland heritage area, as no ground disturbing activities are proposed and as vehicles will use existing access tracks.

While unrecorded heritage places and objects may occur within existing easements, further detrimental impacts are unlikely due to the small scale of proposed works and their focus on areas of existing infrastructure.

Advice:

The Council advises that proposal is unlikely to have a significant adverse environmental impact, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Works are to be constrained to the areas highlighted in "Evoenergy OPGW Maintenance Works" (Purdon, 2018);
- 2. Vehicle access is to be limited to existing tracks only;and
- 3. Should any unrecorded heritage places or objects be encountered during works, works at that location are to cease to allow for heritage assessment and management (in accordance with Sections 74 and 75 of the Heritage Act 2004) and the discovery is to be reported to the Council within five working days (in accordance with Section 51 of the *Heritage Act 2004*).
