Pursuant to Section 138AB of the *Planning and Development Act 2007* and Section 60 of the *Heritage Act 2004*, the ACT Heritage Council advises that:

The proposal is unlikely to have a significant adverse environmental impact, subject to compliance with the conditions described below.

Background:

On 27 August 2019, an application for an Environmental Significance Opinion (ESO201900039) was referred to the ACT Heritage Council (the Council), for proposed works within an existing transmission line between Mugga Lane and Long Gully Road.

Proposed works include the installation of one new power pole, and the installation of All-Dielectric Self-Supporting (ADSS) cable to the existing transmission line. The only ground disturbing activity of the proposal is associated with the new pole '20A' located at, approximately, MGA 693941 6081562. All works are to be undertaken using existing tracks within the easement.

The ESO application sets out that the easement contains only one Aboriginal place, being a potential archaeological deposit (PAD) recorded as 'Block-D PAD 2', which is well removed from the new 20A pole. Further, the application contains provisions for excluding vehicle movement on the PAD, and refers to an Unanticipated Discovery Protocol (UDP) being included in the Construction Environment Management Plan (CEMP) for the project.

Decision and Conditions:

The Council advises that proposal is unlikely to have a significant adverse environmental impact, subject to compliance with the following conditions:

- 1. No works are to be undertaken beyond the development area identified in the ESO application without prior advice from the Council; and
- 2. The project CEMP and UDP is to be provided to and endorsed by the Council prior to works commencing.
