1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Road Transport* (*General*) Canberra Metro Authorised People Appointment 2021 (No 1).

2 Commencement

This appointment commences on the day after it is signed.

3 Appointment

I appoint each of the persons specified in column 1 of schedule 1 to be an authorised person for the provisions of the road transport legislation specified in column 2 of schedule 2.

I am satisfied that each person appointed in schedule 1 to this instrument complies with the requirements in section 19 (3) of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999*.

Note The Road Transport (General) Road Transport Authority Delegation 2021 (No 1) (NI2021-197) delegates specific public employees in the Transport Canberra and City Services Directorate, including to the Executive Branch Manager, Light Rail Operations, the powers and functions under the Road Transport (General) Act 1999, for which the Director-General of the Transport Canberra and City Services Directorate is both the road transport authority and relevant administering authority.

Authorised person means a person listed in schedule 1 who is appointed under section 19 of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999* for the road transport legislation.
