# THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 2 of 1926.

## AN ORDINANCE

To provide for Precautions against Fire.

**B**E it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Fire Precautions Ordinance* 1926. Short title.

2. The Federal Capital Commission may make regulations prescribing all matters necessary or convenient to be prescribed with respect to— Regulations.

- (a) the stacking, storing and keeping of combustible articles : and
- (b) measures for minimizing the danger of fire.

3. Any person who commits an offence against, or contravenes, any provision of the Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and, where the offence is a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every day on which the offence continues. Penalties.
