

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 16 of 1930.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Education Ordinance 1928.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1930*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Education Ordinance 1930*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Education Ordinance 1928* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Education Ordinance 1928-1930*.

2. Section eight of the Principal Ordinance is amended— Compulsory attendance at school.

(a) by omitting from sub-section (1.) the word “regularly” and inserting in its stead the words “, on each half-day when the school is open,”; and

(b) by omitting from sub-section (2.) the words “in which the child is a scholar”.

3. After section eight of the Principal Ordinance, the following section is inserted:— Certificate of principal of school to be evidence of facts stated therein.

“8A. A certificate purporting to be under the hand of the head master or principal teacher of a school maintained by or on behalf of the Commonwealth or a school certified under this Ordinance stating—

(a) that a child is or is not attending such school;

(b) the particulars of attendance of a child at such school; or

(c) that a child has obtained a certificate certifying that the child has been educated up to the prescribed standard of education,

shall be evidence of the facts stated in such certificate.”.

Conveyance of
children to and
from school.

4. After section twenty-seven of the Principal Ordinance, the following section is inserted:—

“27A. The Minister may make provision for the conveyance of children to and from any school in the Territory.”.
