AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Fish Protection Ordinance 1929.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1930*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Fish Protection Ordinance 1931*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Fish Protection Ordinance 1929* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Fish Protection Ordinance 1929-1931*.

2. The Principal Ordinance is amended as set out in the Schedule to this Ordinance. Amendment of Principal Ordinance.

3. Section five of the Principal Ordinance is repealed. Repeal of s. 5.

4. Section eleven of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the words "that portion of the Cotter River or its tributaries which lies above the junction of Paddy's River with the Cotter River or in any of the following rivers or creeks, namely:—Paddy's River; Gudgenby River; Naas River; and their tributaries," and inserting in their stead the words "any portion of the Cotter River, Gudgenby River or their tributaries,". Use of artificial bait.
