AN ORDINANCE

**Relating to the renewal of licences granted under
the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1932 and for other
purposes.**

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor (Renewal of Licences) Ordinance 1934*. Short title and citation.

2.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1932*, where the Magistrate, during the month of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, granted a renewal of a licence, and the fee fixed by the Magistrate for the licence was paid to and accepted by the Registrar after the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and the Registrar purported to issue a licence in pursuance of the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1932*, the fee shall be deemed to have been paid and accepted on the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and the licence shall be, and shall be deemed at all times to have been, as valid and effectual as if the fee had been paid and accepted on the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three. Validation of certain payments and licences.

(2.) Notwithstanding anything contained in the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1932*, where the Magistrate during the month of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, granted a renewal of a licence, the fee fixed by the Magistrate for the renewal of the licence may be paid to and accepted by the Registrar on or before the sixteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and the fee, if so paid and accepted, shall be deemed to have been paid and accepted on the twenty-first day

of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and the Registrar shall issue a licence accordingly under the *Liquor Ordinance* 1929-1932, and any licence so issued shall be deemed to have been in force as on and from the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

Interpretation. 3. Words and expressions used in this Ordinance shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the same meanings as in the *Liquor Ordinance* 1929-1932.
