

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 26 of 1936.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1935.

BE it ordained by the Deputy of the Governor-General in and
over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the
Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred
by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act* 1909 and the *Seat of
Government (Administration) Act* 1910-1933, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance* Short title
and citation.
1936.

(2.) The *Liquor Ordinance* 1929-1935 is in this Ordinance
referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance,
may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance* 1929-1936.

2. Section twenty of the Principal Ordinance is amended by
adding at the end of sub-section (3.) the following proviso:— Conditions of
renewal of
Residential
Hotel Licence.

“Provided further that, where a Residential Hotel Licence has
been granted to the holder of a Café Licence and has not been in
force during the whole of the twelve months immediately preceding
the application for the renewal the licence-fee payable by the
licensee on the renewal of the licence shall be a sum equal to Five
per centum of the amount paid or payable for all liquor (including
duties thereon) purchased or procured, during the twelve months
immediately preceding the application, for disposal under the Café
Licence or under the licence sought to be renewed.”

3. Section twenty-three of the Principal Ordinance is amended
by adding at the end thereof the following sub-section:— Licensing of
new premises.

“(5.) Where, pursuant to a certificate granted under section
thirty-three of this Ordinance, a Residential Hotel Licence is issued
to a person who is the holder of a Café Licence, the Café Licence

shall thereupon become void and of no further effect and determine, and that person shall be entitled to a refund of such portion of the licence-fee paid on the last renewal of the Café Licence as bears to half the amount of that licence-fee the same proportion as the period from the determination of the Café Licence until the thirty-first day of December next following the determination bears to the period of one year."
