AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Fish Protection Ordinance 1929-1935.

BE it ordained by the Deputy of the Governor-General in and
over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the
Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred
by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act* 1909 and the *Seat of
Government (Administration) Act* 1910-1933, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Fish Protection Ordinance* 1936. Short title
and citation.

(2.) The *Fish Protection Ordinance* 1929-1935 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Fish Protection Ordinance* 1929-1936.

2. Section twenty-four A of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from the second proviso thereto the words “to the east of a line drawn between Bristol Point and Plantation Point” and inserting in their stead the words “to the north-east of a line drawn between Bristol Point and Plantation Point or to the south-east of a line drawn between the southern extremity of Longnose Point and a point on the southern shore of Jervis Bay thirty chains north-westerly from the right bank of Telegraph Creek at its intersection with high water mark”. Permit to go on

sea-fishing.

The Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following Schedule inserted in its stead:— The Schedule.

“ THE SCHEDULE.

All that part of the waters of Jervis Bay bounded as follows: Commencing at a point on the high water mark of the southern shore of Jervis Bay distant 30 chains along such high water mark north-westerly from the intersection of that water mark with the right bank of Telegraph Creek and bounded thence by another part of the high water mark of Jervis Bay bearing generally north-westerly to Captain's Point thence again by high water mark generally south-westerly and north-westerly to a point on the south-western shore of Jervis Bay being the eastern extremity of the northern boundary

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of land accepted by the Commonwealth in pursuance of the *Jerris Bay Territory Acceptance Act 1915* thence by part of a line bearing north-easterly toward high water mark on the northern extremity of Bowen Island about 92 chains to its intersection with a line joining high water mark at the north-eastern extremity of Plantation Point and high water mark at the northern extremity of Bristol Point thence south-easterly by part of the lastmentioned line about 64 chains to its intersection with a line joining the commencing point aforesaid and high water mark at the southern extremity of Longnose Point thence south-westerly by part of the lastmentioned line about 33 chains to the point of commencement."
