AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Police Superannuation Ordinance 1928-1941.

BE it ordained by the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1940*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Police Superannuation Ordinance 1944*.^{*} Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Police Superannuation Ordinance 1928-1941*, as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as the *Police Superannuation Ordinance 1928-1944*.

2. After section 3 of the *Police Superannuation Ordinance 1928-1941*, the following section is inserted:—

“3c.—(1.) Any member of the Police Force who was, immediately prior to his appointment as such a member, a member of the Police Force of the Northern Territory, may, within three months after his appointment or within twelve months after the commencement of this section, whichever is the later date, pay to the Consolidated Revenue Fund an amount equal to the sum of any contributions made by that member to the Superannuation Fund established under the *Superannuation Act 1922-1943* up to the date of his appointment as a member of the Police Force, and thereupon his service as a member of the Police Force of the Northern Territory shall, for all the purposes of this Ordinance, be deemed to be service as a member of the Police Force.” Former members of the Police Force of the Northern Territory.

“(2.) Moneys paid to the Consolidated Revenue Fund in accordance with sub-section (1.) of this section shall, for all the purposes of this Ordinance, be deemed to be rateable deductions from the member by whom they are paid.”
