## AN ORDINANCE

### To amend the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1943.

**B**E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1940*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance 1945*.<sup>\*</sup> Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1943*, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1945*.

2. After section forty-three D of the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1943* the following section is inserted:—

“43E.—(1.) A holder of a Residential Hotel Licence shall not, during trading hours, sell, supply or dispose of, or cause or permit to be sold, supplied or disposed of, liquor in or upon any part of his licensed premises unless at the time of the sale, supply or disposal of the liquor— Public bars to be kept open.

(a) a public bar-room in those premises is open to the public for the purchase and consumption by the public of liquor; and

(b) liquor of the same class or kind as the liquor sold, supplied or disposed of elsewhere on the licensed premises is available in reasonable quantities to the public for purchase and consumption in that public bar-room.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

“(2.) For the purposes of the last preceding sub-section, ‘public bar-room’ means a bar-room where liquor is served over the counter to the public and which is not—

(a) a bar-room of the type or class commonly known as a ‘Private Bar’, ‘Saloon Bar’ or by any name of similar import; or

- (b) a bar-room (howsoever called) in or in respect of which there is any restriction, limitation or special provision, whether as to the liquor which is served therein or the price (other than as fixed by the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner) of liquor so served or as to the persons admitted thereto or otherwise howsoever.”.
