AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Fish Protection Ordinance 1929-1936.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1947*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Fish Protection Ordinance 1949*.^{*} Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Fish Protection Ordinance 1929-1936* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Fish Protection Ordinance 1929-1949*.

2. Section seventeen A of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the word “twenty-five” and inserting in its stead the word “ten”. Maximum number of fish to be taken.

3. Section twenty-four A of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the second proviso. Permits to go on lands for purpose of sea fishing.

4. Sections twenty-four B, twenty-four F, twenty-four H, twenty-four K and the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance are repealed. Prohibition of net fishing.
