

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Nurses Registration Ordinance 1933-1941.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1947*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Nurses Registration Ordinance 1949*.*

Short title
and citation.

(2.) The *Nurses Registration Ordinance 1933-1941* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Nurses Registration Ordinance 1933-1949*.

2. Section six of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting sub-sections (5.) to (9.) (inclusive) and inserting in their stead the following sub-sections:—

Members of
the Board.

“(5.) The Director-General may appoint a Senior Medical Officer of the Department of Health to be his deputy.

(6.) The Senior Medical Officer so appointed shall, in the event of the absence of the Director-General from a meeting of the Board, be entitled to attend that meeting and, when so attending, shall be deemed to be a member of the Board and shall be Chairman of the Board.

(7.) A quorum of the Board shall consist of the Chairman and one member.

(8.) The Chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and, in the event of equality of voting, a second or casting vote.”

3. Section twenty-one of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from sub-section (3.) the words “or Deputy Chairman”.
