AN ORDINANCE

To make Special Provision in respect of the Sale and Supply of Liquor in the Area in which the Upper Cotter Dam is being Constructed.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Ordinance under the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1955*.

LIQUOR (UPPER COTTER DAM) ORDINANCE 1958.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor (Upper Cotter Dam) Ordinance 1958*.^{*}

2.—(1.) The Minister may, on behalf of the Commonwealth, enter into an agreement with a person authorizing the sale or supply, by or on behalf of that person, of beer in premises made available by the Commonwealth for the purpose in the area in which the Upper Cotter Dam is being constructed.

(2.) Without limiting the generality of the matters upon which an agreement may be entered into under the last preceding sub-section, the agreement shall specify—

- (a) the persons to whom beer may be sold or supplied;
- (b) the manner in which beer may be sold or supplied;
- (c) the times at which beer may be sold or supplied in the premises;

- (d) the payments to be made to the Commonwealth by the person who has entered into the agreement with the Minister; and
- (e) the records to be kept, and the returns to be furnished, by that person for the purposes of the agreement.

(3.) An agreement entered into under sub-section (1.) of this section may be varied or terminated in the manner specified in the agreement.

Liquor Ordinance does not apply to sale or supply of beer in accordance with an agreement.

3.—(1.) Where a person has entered into an agreement with the Minister under the last preceding section, the *Liquor Ordinance* 1929-1956 does not apply to, or in relation to, the sale or supply, in accordance with the agreement, of beer by or on behalf of that person.

(2.) Nothing in this Ordinance prevents the application of the *Liquor Ordinance* 1929-1956 to, or in relation to, a sale or supply of liquor that is made otherwise than in accordance with an agreement entered into under the last preceding section.

(3.) In the last preceding sub-section, "liquor" has the same meaning as in the *Liquor Ordinance* 1929-1956.
