To amend the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1968*.

### LIQUOR ORDINANCE 1971

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance 1971*.<sup>\*</sup> Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1968*<sup>†</sup> is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1971*.

2. Section 6A of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

- (a) by omitting from sub-section (1.) all the words from and including the words “in a building” and inserting in their stead the words “in an exempt University building”;
- (b) by omitting from sub-section (2.) the words “in a building of the University” and inserting in their stead the words “in an exempt University building”;
- (c) by omitting from paragraph (b) of sub-section (3.) the words “the University” and inserting in their stead the words “an exempt University building”; and

Sale of liquor in the University.

(d) by inserting in sub-section (4.), before the definition of "Statute", the following definition:—

“‘exempt University building’ means a building occupied by the University or by a residential college affiliated under a Statute with the University, being a building in which the sale of liquor is, for the time being, authorized by Statute;”.

3. After section 6A of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

Sale of liquor in the Canberra College of Advanced Education.

“ 6B.—(1.) The provisions of this Ordinance (other than the provisions of this section) relating to the sale of liquor do not apply to the sale of liquor in an exempt College building.

“(2.) A person shall not sell or purchase liquor in an exempt College building contrary to a provision of a Statute.

“(3.) The Council of the College shall pay to the Registrar a fee equal to four per centum of the amount (including duties) paid or payable for all liquor purchased or procured, for sale in an exempt College building, during the period commencing on the date of commencement of this section and ending on the thirty-first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-one, and during each subsequent period of twelve months ending on the thirty-first day of October.

“(4.) The Council of the College shall pay the fee, if any, under the last preceding sub-section on or before the thirty-first day of December immediately after the end of each period in respect of which the fee is payable.

“(5.) In this section—

‘exempt College building’ means a building occupied by the College, being a building in which the sale of liquor is, for the time being, authorized by Statute;

‘Statute’ means a Statute of the College;

‘the College’ means the Canberra College of Advanced Education established under the *Canberra College of Advanced Education Act 1967-1970*.”.

Exemption of Canberra Theatre Centre.

4. Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting in sub-section (3.), after the word “amount”, the words “(including duties) ”.

Fee for renewal of licences.

5. Section 35B of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting after paragraph (c) of sub-section (4.) the following paragraph:—

“(ca) amounts payable by the Canberra College of Advanced Education established under the *Canberra College of Advanced Education Act 1967-1970*;”.
