TRESPASS ON COMMONWEALTH LANDS ORDINANCE 1973

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance* 1973.* Short title
and citation.

(2) The *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance* 1932-1972,† as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance* 1932-1973.

2. Section 3 of the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance* 1932-1972 is repealed and the following section substituted:—

“3. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.
‘animal’ means any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, foal, ass, mule, bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, ram, ewe, wether, sheep, lamb, goat or pig;
‘road’ means any street, road, lane, thoroughfare or footpath open to, or used by, the public.”.

3. Sections 8A, 8B and 8C of the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance* 1932-1972 are repealed. Repeal.
