TRADING HOURS REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Trading Hours Regulations. Short title.

2. A certificate of appointment of an inspector shall be in accordance with Form 1 in the Schedule to these Regulations. Certificate of appointment of inspector.

3. The notice of the choice of a shopkeeper as to the closing time on Wednesday of any shop occupied by him shall be in accordance with Form 2 in the Schedule to these Regulations. Notice of choice of closing time on Wednesday
