Regulations under the Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930.

I FRANK ANSTEY, Minister of State for Health, for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Home Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930 and the Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930, hereby make the following Regulations to come into operation forthwith.

PUBLIC HEALTH (EATING HOUSES) REGULATIONS.

Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health (Eating Houses) Regulations.

Definitions.

- 2. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
 "approved" means approved by the Director-General;
 - "eating house" means any house, tent, edifice, building or other structure (permanent or otherwise) or any part thereof in which meals are served to the public for gain or reward not being licensed premises within the meaning of the Liquor Ordinance 1929 or premises in respect of which an authority under that Ordinance for licensees temporarily to sell, supply or dispose of liquor on premises other than those specified in their licences is in force, or any boarding house or any other house, tent, edifice, building or other structure used temporarily for serving meals to the public at any fair, show, military encampment, races or other public sports, games or amusements;
 - "Minister" means the Minister of State for Health;
 - "proprietor" includes the owner, the occupier or any person having the management or control of an eating house.

Eating houses to be registered and name of proprietor entered.

- 3. A person shall not act as the proprietor of an eating house unless the eating house has been duly registered and his name has been entered as the proprietor thereof in accordance with these Regulations.
- 4.—(1.) Every person applying for the registration of an eating house and the entry of his name as the proprietor thereof shall make such application to the Director-General in accordance with the Form A in the Schedule to these Regulations and shall forward therewith a fee of Ten shillings.
- (2.) Upon the granting of the application, the Director-General shall supply to the applicant a certificate in accordance with the Form B in the Schedule to these Regulations.
- (3.) Every such certificate shall continue in force until the person entered thereon as proprietor ceases to act as proprietor or until thirty-first day of December next following the date of the certificate, whichever is the sooner.
- (4.) During the first week in January in each year, the proprietor of an eating house shall make application for the renewal of the registration thereof.

Power to refuse to register any enting house.

5. The Director-General may, in his discretion, register or refuse to register any enting house.

- 6. At any time during the currency of registration, the Minister Cancellation of registration. may, after written notice to the proprietor, cancel the registration.
- 7. Every proprietor shall cause the cating house to be maintained Premises to be kept clean. at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.
 - 8. The proprietor-
 - (a) shall provide a sufficient number of approved impervious Garbage receptacles with close fitting covers for the reception of be provided. food scraps or trade waste;
 - (b) shall not permit or suffer food scraps or trade waste to be placed elsewhere than in such receptacles; and
 - (c) shall cause such receptacles to be kept at all times in a clean and sanitary condition. State of a state
- 9.—(1.) The proprietor shall not suffer or permit food scraps Disposal of or trade waste for consumption by pigs to be removed from the eating food scraps, &c. house between the hours of 9 a.m. and 8 p.m.
- (2.) Where food scraps or trade waste are disposed of to contractors, the proprietor shall cause a clean, washed and disinfected receptacle to be provided in place of any receptacle containing food or waste which is removed by the contractors.
- 10. The proprietor shall cause all sanitary conveniences upon or Cleanliness of in connection with the eating house to be kept at all times in a conveniences. scrupulously clean condition.
- 11. The proprietor shall provide sufficient means of ablution (with aboutionary clean towels and soap) for the use of employees and sufficient sinks appliances to supplied with water under pressure for the adequate cleansing of all utensils used on the premises in the preparation and consumption of
- 12. The proprietor shall not permit or suffer to be occupied as a Prohibitions sleeping place any room which is in direct communication with any sleeping rooms. dining room, kitchen or other place used in the preparation or storage of food stuffs.
- 13. The proprietor shall cause all food stuffs to be stored in such Storage of food. place or manner as to prevent contamination with flies, dust or vermin.
- 14. The proprietor shall cause every ice chest to be kept at all Ice chests to be times in a clean and wholesome condition and, if meat is stored in any kept clean. such chest, the chest shall be kept exclusively for that purpose.
 - 15. The proprietor—

(a) shall not suffer or permit to be used in the preparation of food not to be food any tinned milks, fruits, jam or fish which, upon opening, show any signs of decomposition of the preparation of decomposition. opening, show any signs of decomposition, fermentation or alteration in appearance;

- (b) shall not suffer or permit to be used in the preparation of food any bad eggs or rancid butter; and
- (c) shall forthwith destroy or place in the refuse receptacle any food which is unwholesome.
- 16. The proprietor shall cause all used utensils, crockery and cleaning of cutlery to be washed in clean hot soapy water.
- 17.—(1.) Every employee shall be cleanly in his person and shall employee to be not smoke or spit within any dining room or kitchen appurtenant clean.
 - (2.) Before handling any food, an employee shall wash his hands.
- 18. The proprietor shall not allow any dog in any dining room or Dogs to be prohibited. kitchen appurtenant thereto.
- 19. The proprietor shall, at all times, keep all sinks, gullies and sinks, &c., to be kept clean. grease traps in a clean and sanitary condition.
- 20. The proprietor shall comply with any direction given by an compliance authorized officer with respect to the maintenance of the premises in with directions. a clean and sanitary condition.
- 21. An authorized officer may at all reasonable times enter and Right of inspection. inspect any eating house.
- 22. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any Penalties. provision of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds; and, where the offence is a continuing offence, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day during which the offence continues; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
