

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

Regulations under the Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930.

I CHARLES WILLIAM CLANAN MARR, Minister of State for Health, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for the Interior, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930*, and the *Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930*, hereby make the following regulations to come into operation forthwith.

PUBLIC HEALTH (MEAT) REGULATIONS.

1.—Regulation 23 of the Public Health (Meat) Regulations 1931, is hereby repealed and the following regulation inserted in its place:—

“23.—(1.) Any contravention of these Regulations shall be deemed to be an offence against these Regulations.

(2.) In any prosecution for an offence against these Regulations—

- (a) evidence that meat was sold from, or exposed for sale in or from a vehicle bearing thereon the name or trade name of a person carrying on the business of selling meat shall be prima facie evidence that the meat was sold or exposed for sale by that person; and
- (b) evidence that meat was in a vehicle bearing thereon the name or trade name of a person carrying on the business of selling meat shall be prima facie evidence that the meat was in the possession of that person for sale.”
