

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

Regulations under the Business Names Ordinance 1933.

I JOHN GREIG LATHAM, Attorney-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Business Names Ordinance* 1933, hereby make the following Regulations to come into force on the twenty-sixth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Business Names Regulations 1934. Short title.

2. Any person who by the *Business Names Ordinance* 1933 is required to send or deliver any statement, and upon whom a written demand in that behalf is made by the Registrar, shall comply with that demand within seven days after the date on which the letter of demand was posted or within such longer period as may be stated therein. Time for compliance with demand.

3. A firm or person carrying on business in a firm-name shall effect registration by sending by post or delivering to the Registrar a statement in accordance with Form A in the First Schedule to these Regulations. Form of registration.

4. Whenever a change is made or occurs in any of the particulars required for registration in respect of any firm or person, the firm or person shall send by post or deliver to the Registrar a statement in writing in accordance with Forms B, C, D or E in the First Schedule to these Regulations, whichever is applicable. Form of registration of changes in firm.

5.—(1.) The fees to be paid under the *Business Names Ordinance* 1933 and these Regulations shall, if paid at the Registry, be paid in cash and, if sent by post, shall be remitted by money order, postal note, or bank draft, made payable to the Registrar of Firms. Fees.

(2.) Excepting where provided for in the *Business Names Ordinance 1933* the fees payable under that Ordinance or these Regulations shall be those specified in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
