Regulations under the Education Ordinance 1937-1942.*

JOSEPH SILVER COLLINGS, Minister of State for the Interior, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Education Ordinance 1937-1942, hereby make the following Regulations.

EDUCATION REGULATIONS.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Education Regulations.
- 2. All regulations made in pursuance of the Education Ordinance Repeal. 1928, or under that Ordinance as subsequently amended, and in force immediately prior to the commencement of the Education Ordinance 1937, and the regulations made under the Education Ordinance 1937-1938 on the nineteenth day of December, 1938, are repealed.
 - 3. These Regulations are divided into Parts, as follows:—

4.—(1.) In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention Definitions. appears-

"Attendance Inspector" means an Attendance Inspector appointed under section 7 of the Ordinance;

"Director of Education" means the Director of Education of the State of New South Wales;

"Inspector of Schools" means an Inspector appointed under the Public Service Act 1902 of the State of New South Wales for the purposes of the Public Instruction Act of 1880. the Public Instruction (Amendment) Act, 1916 and the Public Instruction (Amendment) Act, 1917 of that State;

"Leaving Certificate Examination" means the Leaving Certificate Examination conducted by the Department of Education of the State of New South Wales;

- "Intermediate Certificate Examination" means the Intermediate Certificate Examination conducted by the Department of Education of the State of New South Wales;
- "public school" means a school established or maintained by or on behalf of the Commonwealth;
- "secondary school", for the purposes of Part IV. of these Regulations, includes a High School established or maintained by or on behalf of the Commonwealth;
- "the City Area" means the City Area as defined in the City Area Leases Ordinance 1936-1938;
- "the Board" means the Bursary Endowment Board of the State of New South Wales;
- "the Fund" means the Bursary Endowment Fund established under these Regulations;
- "the Ordinance" means the Education Ordinance 1937-1942, as amended from time to time;
- "the Registrar" means the Registrar of Schools appointed under section 7 of the Ordinance;
- (2.) Any reference to a Form in these Regulations shall be read as a reference to a Form in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

PART II.—PRESCRIBED FORMS AND PRESCRIBED PERSONS AND AUTHORITIES.

Form of exemption certificate.

- 5. A certificate granted under paragraph (c) of section 10, or under section 16, of the Ordinance, shall be in accordance with Form 1.
- Returns under sections 15 (1.) (c) and 30 of the Ordinarce. 5 or 6 as is appropriate to the case.
 - (2.) The Registrar may require the proprietor or principal teacher of any school to furnish such further and fuller information concerning the attendance of scholars as the Registrar deems necessary.
 - 7. Any Inspector of Schools shall be the prescribed person or authority for the purposes of section 16 of the Ordinance.
 - 8. The Registrar shall be the prescribed person or authority for the purposes of sub-section (4.) of section 18 of the Ordinance.
 - 9. An application for the first registration of a school under section 22 of the Ordinance shall be in accordance with Form 7.
 - 10. A Provisional Certificate of Registration under section 22 of the Ordinance shall be in accordance with Form 8.
 - 11. Any Inspector of Schools shall be the prescribed person of authority for the purposes of sections 23 and 24 of the Ordinance.

PART III.—CONVEYANCE OF SCHOOL CHILDREN.

16 .-- (1.) Where the Minister is satisfied that a satisfactory arrange- Grants in atd ment for the conveyance of children to and from any school in the of conveyance of children to Territory has been made by the parents or guardians of those children, and from school. the Minister may, subject to this Part of these Regulations, approve of a grant to the parent or guardian of any such child in aid of the conveyance of that child to and from school at the prescribed rate.

- (2.) The parent or guardian of any child in respect of whom a grant in aid of conveyance is claimed shall fill in and forward to the Registrar a form of application in accordance with Form 12 and shall make a statutory declaration in accordance with Form 14 and shall furnish such other information as the Registrar requires.
- (3.) A grant in aid of conveyance shall be payable as on and from the date on which an application in accordance with the last preceding sub-regulation is made.
- 17. Subject to the next succeeding regulation, a grant in aid of children in conveyance may be claimed in respect of the following children:-

respect of whom grant may be made.

- (a) Any child over the age of six years and under the age of eleven years living more than two miles from the school; and
- (b) Any child over the age of eleven years living more than three miles from the school,

the distance in each case being by the nearest practicable walking

Provided that, where children are not conveyed the full distance from their homes, grants in aid of their conveyance may be made where the distance they are actually conveyed exceeds two miles.

- 18.—(1.) A grant in aid of conveyance shall not be payable or Croumstances continue to be payable in respect of the following classes of children:— in which grant not payable.
 - (a) Children who have completed three years of super-primary or secondary work from the time of leaving any primary school;

(b) Children the income of whose parents or guardians during the year ended on the thirtieth day of June preceding the date of the application, or on any subsequent thirtieth day of June, after deduction is made of any amount necessarily expended in the treatment or support of any invalid wholly or partially dependent on such parents or guardians, exceeds a quota of £80 for each member of the family, other than such invalid, including the parents or guardians, and excluding children earning a wage of 15s. or more weekly:

Provided that this sub-regulation shall not affect any boy or girl whose parents' or guardians' income during the relevant year, before making such deduction, is less than £300:

(c) Children who travel to and from school by bicycle; and

- (d) Children who may travel to and from school by motor omnibus or other conveyance at a fare not exceeding one penny per journey.
- (2.) It shall be the duty of every parent or guardian of a child in respect of whom a grant in aid of conveyance has been made—
 - (a) to inform the Registrar of any change in circumstances by reason of which the grant ceases to be payable within one month after the end of the year in which the change takes place; and
 - (b) whenever required by the Registrar, to furnish a statutory declaration in accordance with Form 14 having reference to the year ended on any thirtieth day of June specified by the Registrar.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

(3.) It shall be a defence to a prosecution under paragraph (a) of the last preceding sub-regulation to prove that the Registrar was informed, within the period mentioned in that sub-regulation, of the change in circumstances, by any one parent or guardian, of the child in respect of whom the grant was made.

Rate of grant in aid of conveyance, 19. The rate of the grant in aid of conveyance payable under this Part shall be sixpence per child for each complete day of attendance but shall not exceed one shilling and sixpence per day in respect of any one family.

Arrangement made by Parents' Committee for conveyance of children. 20. Where a majority of the parents and guardians in any locality form a parents' committee to make an arrangement for the conveyance of their children to and from school and the committee enters into an agreement with a contractor for the purpose, the grant in aid of the conveyance of such children, at the prescribed rate, shall be paid to the contractor through a teacher nominated by the Registrar.

Commonwealth not liable for claims in relation to conveyance. 21. The fact of the payment under these Regulations of a grant in aid of conveyance shall not render the Commonwealth liable in respect of any claim arising in relation to or as a result of such conveyance, nor place the Commonwealth under any responsibility as regards the type of vehicle used for such conveyance.

PART IV .-- BURSARIES.

Division 1.—General.

- 22.—(1.) The Minister may establish a Bursary Endowment Fund Bursary Endowment with moneys donated for the purpose.
- (2.) Any person may donate any sum of money to the Fund, and that sum shall be carried to the capital account.
- 23. The Minister shall invest moneys standing to the credit of the Investment Fund in Government securities of the Commonwealth, but may, in of Fund. pursuance of any conditions or directions imposed by a donor, invest the donation in any other securities named by the donor.
- 24. The Minister may establish and maintain bursaries entitling the Bursaries. holders thereof to proceed to a secondary school approved by the Minister, and shall apply for that purpose the interest of the Fund so invested and such other moneys as are available for that purpose.
- 25. The Minister shall determine the bursaries to be tenable at How bursaries secondary schools, and the Board may award those bursaries without to be allotted regard to the school which the bursar has attended, provided that the school is in the Territory.

26.—(1.) Any person who donates any sum to the Fund may at Private the time of the donation specify the bursary to which he desires the persons subscribing to interest on the sum to be applied.

- (2.) The Minister shall give effect to the expressed desire of any name bursaries. such person.
- (3.) If that person desires that his donation should be set apart for a separate bursary, he may, with the approval of the Minister, give any name he pleases to that bursary.
- 27.—(1.) A boy or girl shall not be eligible to obtain or to continue Candidates to hold a bursary if the total income of the parents or guardians during eligible. the year ended on the thirtieth day of June preceding the date of the application, or on any subsequent thirtieth day of June, after deduction is made of any amount necessarily expended in the treatment or support of any invalid wholly or partially dependent on such parents or guardians, exceeds a quota of £80 for each member of the family, other than such invalid, including the parents or guardians, and excluding children earning a wage of 15s. or more weekly:

Provided that this sub-regulation shall not affect any boy or girl whose parents' or guardians' income during the relevant year, before making such deduction, is less than £300.

- (2.) It shall be the duty of every parent or guardian of a bursar-
 - (a) to inform the Registrar of any change in circumstances which renders the bursar ineligible to continue to hold the bursary within one month after the end of the year in which the change takes place; and

(b) whenever required by the Registrar, to furnish a statutory declaration in accordance with Form 14 having reference to the year ended on any thirtieth day of June specified by the Registrar.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

(3.) It shall be a defence to a prosecution under paragraph (a) of the last preceding sub-regulation to prove that the Registrar was informed, within the period mentioned in that sub-regulation, of the change in circumstances, by any one parent or guardian, of the bursar.

Withdrawal of bursary.

28. A bursary may be withdrawn by the Minister at any time during its currency if the holder ceases to be eligible to continue to hold a bursary, or fails to attend classes regularly and punctually, or fails to give evidence of satisfactory progress, or if the report of the Principal of the school or college upon the conduct of the holder is not satisfactory.

Application for bursaries.

- 29.—(1.) Parents or guardians of candidates for bursaries shall fill in and forward to the Registrar a form of application in accordance with Form 13, and one of the parents or guardians in each case shall make a statutory declaration in accordance with Form 14, not later than three weeks prior to the date on which the examination is held, and shall furnish such other information as the Registrar requires.
- (2.) The Minister or the Board may reject any application for a bursary where the form of application and statutory declaration are not completed in accordance with these Regulations.

Division 2.—Bursaries Admitting to a Course of Secondary Instruction.

Limit of age.

30. Bursaries, of such number as is determined by the Minister, may, subject to these Regulations, be awarded annually by the Board to boys and girls who are not less than 11 years of age and not more than 13 years of age on the date fixed for the qualifying examination for bursaries, and who, in the opinion of the Board, show the greatest merit in that qualifying examination.

Nature of burraries.

- 31.—(1.) Each bursary shall comprise a grant of £40 for the first year's course, £40 for the second, £40 for the third, £50 for the fourth and £50 for the fifth year's course, to holders who may have to live away from home in order to attend the school they have selected, or a grant of £12 for the first year's course, £12 for the second, £12 for the third, £18 for the fourth, and £24 for the fifth year's course, to holders who can travel to and from school and home daily.
- (2.) Each bursary shall also entitle the holder to a grant of textbooks or other school material for personal use not exceeding the value of £1 10s. per annum.
- (3.) In cases presenting special circumstances the Minister may grant allowances at higher or lower rates than those specified in this regulation.

Tenure of bursaries.

32.—(1.) The normal currency of a bursary shall be for five years with monetary grants for each year as provided in the last preceding regulation:

Provided that any bursar who desires to do so, may, with the consent of the principal of the school at which his bursary is tenable, complete his course in four years.

- (2.) Payments shall be made at the end of each school term, and the continuance of the bursary shall be dependent upon the satisfactory work and conduct of the student during the preceding term as shown by a report made to the Registrar by the principal of the school at which the bursar attends.
- 33. The bursaries annually made available by the Minister shall Allotments of be open for competition by applicants within the Territory and shall bursaries. be tenable at secondary schools approved by the Minister.
- 34.—(1.) Applicants for bursaries shall be divided into two groups grouping of —one group comprising all candidates who attend schools with less candidates. than 100 pupils in enrolment and the other group from schools with more than 100 in eurolment.
- (2.) The number of bursaries awarded in any year shall be divided between candidates of the two groups approximately in the same proportion as that in which the number of candidates who pass the qualifying examination is so divided:

Provided that, if a satisfactory standard be not reached by candidates in either group, the bursaries unallotted in that group may be awarded to candidates in the other group.

- 35. The Board may arrange for such qualifying examinations as Examination are necessary to be held to determine the award of bursaries.
- 36. Bursars may be received into advanced standing in secondary Bursars schools, provided that they give evidence to the satisfaction of the advanced standing.

 Board that their previous studies qualify them therefor.
- 37. Before any bursary is awarded the parent or guardian shall Bursary certify to the Board that it is his intention that the holder of the bursary stay four shall attend at school for at least four years of the period for which the years, bursary is tenable:

Provided that a candidate received into advanced standing shall be required to attend school only for such time as is necessary to complete the course.

- 38.--(1.) All bursars shall be presented for the Intermediate Attendance Examination at the end either of the second or of the third year of Examination. their secondary school course.
- (2.) A bursar who fails to pass the examination shall not be promoted to a higher year's work except under such special circumstances as are approved by the Board.
- 39. The Board may extend a bursary up to but not beyond the end Extension of of the school term in which a bursar presents himself for the Leaving Certificate Examination.

Bursaries admitting to secondary courses upon the results of the Intermediate Certificate Examination.

- 40.—(1.) Subject to the approval of the Minister, the Board may allocate in each year bursaries to be awarded to deserving students upon the results of the Intermediate Certificate Examination.
- (2.) Those bursaries shall be of the value of fourth and fifth year bursaries, and shall be tenable for two or three years, subject to the conditions of the last preceding regulation.

Division 3.—Bursaries Admitting to a Course at the Canberra Technical College.

Bursaries for course at Canberra Technical College.

- 41.—(1.) Subject to these Regulations, the Minister may award bursaries, not exceeding six in any one year, tenable at the Canberra Technical College, to youths who have completed a two-year course of secondary education at a secondary school.
- (2.) Any such bursary shall be tenable for one year but may be renewed for a further period not exceeding two years if the holder is not apprenticed during that period and if the Minister is satisfied that the circumstances justify the extension.

Amount of bursary.

- 42. The amount of each such bursary shall be as follows:—
 - (a) In the case of a youth who must necessarily live away from home in order to attend the Canberra Technical College— £40 in respect of the first year's course and £50 in respect of any succeeding year or, where any such youth has passed the Intermediate Examination, £50 in respect of each year of the tenure of the bursary; or
 - (b) In the case of a youth living at home and able to travel to and from home and the College daily—£12 in respect of the first year's course and £25 in respect of any succeeding year or, where any such youth has passed the Intermediate Examination, £25 in respect of each year of the tenure of the bursary.

Examinations and tests for bursaries.

43. The Minister may arrange for such qualifying examinations and practical tests as he considers necessary to be held to determine the award of bursaries.

PART V.—MISCELLANEOUS.

Fees for enrolment at Canberra Technical College. 44. The scales of fees to be charged for enrolment in classes at the Canberra Technical College and the Evening Continuation School shall be as set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

Power of Minister to remit fees.

- 45. The Minister may-
 - (a) postpone the payment, for such time as he determines, of any fee set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations;
 - (b) remit in whole or in part the payment of any such fee; and
 - (c) exempt any class of persons from the payment of any such fee during the present state of war.
