Regulations 1943. No. 2.*

Regulation under the Police Ordinance 1927-1934.

I JOHN ALBERT BEASLEY, the Acting Attorney-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Police Ordinance* 1927-1934, hereby make the following Regulation.

AMENDMENT OF THE POLICE REGULATIONS.

1.—(1.) Regulation 13 of the Police Regulations is amended by omitting the table in sub-regulation (1.) and inserting in its stead the following table:—

(c) When relieving or performing temporary duty at another station—

(Where quarters are provided and the relieving member is unmarried, one-half of these amounts only is, unless the Chief Officer otherwise approves, payable)		
(d) A member of the Force who is absent during the day or night on duty, but who returns to his head-quarters within twenty-four hours	†	†”.

† Actual and necessary expenses incurred for meals or bed.

(2.) This regulation shall be deemed to have commenced on the second day of November, 1942.
