## Regulations under the Aborigines Welfare Ordinance 1954.\*

WILFRED SELWYN KENT HUGHES. Minister of State for the Interior, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Aborigines Welfare Ordinance 1954, hereby make the following Regulations.

## ABORIGINES WELFARE REGULATIONS.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Aborigines Welfare Citation. Regulations.
  - 2. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.
    - "authorized person" means a person appointed under the next succeeding regulation to be an authorized person:
    - "Manager" means a person appointed under the next succeeding regulation to manage a reserve;
    - "the Ordinance" means the Aborigines Welfare Ordinance 1954.
  - 3. The Minister may, by writing under his hand—
    - (a) appoint a person to manage a reserve; and

appoint Managers and (b) appoint a person to be an authorized person for the purposes authorized of these Regulations.

**4.**—(1.) A person other than—

Entry of (a) a person returning to the reserve with the consent of the a reserve. Minister under section 6 of the Ordinance;

- (b) a person ordered to reside in the reserve under section 7 of the Ordinance;
- (c) a resident of the reserve; or
- (d) the Manager, an authorized person or a member of the Police Force.

shall not enter, or remain on, a reserve without a permission in writing granted under the next succeeding sub-regulation.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

(2.) The Minister may grant permission in writing to enter or remain on a reserve and may specify in the permission conditions to be complied with by the person to whom it is granted.

Person permitted to enter reserve to comply with conditions.

- 5. A person granted a permission in writing under the last preceding regulation—
  - (a) shall not fail to comply with the conditions (if any) specified in the permission;
  - (b) shall not refuse or fail to produce the permission for inspection if so required by the Manager, an authorized person or a member of the Police Force; and
  - (c) shall not remain on the reserve when the purpose for which the permission was granted no longer exists.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Maintenance of discipline and good order on a reserve.

- 6.—(1.) The Manager of a reserve may give such orders instructions as are necessary to maintain discipline and good order on the reserve and to secure compliance with regulation 8 of these Regulations.
- (2.) A person shall, while on a reserve, obey all reasonable orders and instructions of the Manager which are applicable to the person.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Liquor and drugs not to be brought on to a reserve.

7. A person shall not, except for use in case of accident or on the prescription of a legally qualified medical practitioner, bring any liquor or narcotic drug on to a reserve.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Certain acts, and possession of certain things, prohibited on a reserve.

**8.**  $\Lambda$  person shall not, on a reserve—

(a) bet or wager or attempt or offer to bet or wager;

(b) play or take part in games of chance, including lotteries or sweepstakes, for money or other valuable thing;

(c) use, or permit to be used, a place for a purpose specified in the last two preceding paragraphs;

(d) keep any livestock or dogs without the permission of the Manager;

 (e) consume, or be in possession of, liquor or a narcotic drug without the permission of the Manager or a legal!
qualified medical practitioner;

(f) be under the influence of liquor or a narcotic drug;

(g) be in possession of a poison without the permission of the Manager;

(h) be in possession of a firearm;

(i) behave indecently or in a disorderly or unseemly manner; or

(j) use threatening or obscene language.

Penalty: Ten pounds.
