## Regulations under the *Police Ordinance* 1927-1975.\*

#### AMENDMENTS OF THE POLICE REGULATIONS†

- 1. Regulation 2 of the Police Regulations is amended by omitting the definition of "the Secretary" and substituting the following definition:
  - "'Permanent Head' means the Permanent Head of the Department of Police and Customs;".
  - 2. Regulation 15a of the Police Regulations is amended—

- Sick leave for
- (a) by omitting from sub-regulation (1) the word "Secretary" (whereinjury sustained or illness ever occurring) and substituting the words "Permanent Head"; and contracted on duty. (b) by omitting from sub-regulation (4) the word "Secretary" (where-

ever occurring) and substituting the words "Permanent Head".

3. Regulation 16 of the Police Regulations is amended by omitting from sub- Sick leave. regulation (2) the word "Secretary" (wherever occurring) and substituting the words "Permanent Head".
