About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Electoral Regulations 1993*, made under the *Electoral Act 1992* (including any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes)) as in force on 17 September 2002. It also includes any amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law to 17 September 2002.

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial changes

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication does not include amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol **U** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date is—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

1 Name of regulations

These regulations are the *Electoral Regulations 1993*.

3 Definitions for regs

In these regulations:

Note A definition applies except so far as the contrary intention appears (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 155).

City of Canberra Arms—see the *City of Canberra Arms Act 1932*, section 3.

government agency—see the *Public Sector Management Act 1994*, section 3.

4 Use of roll information for cancer register

- (1) For the Act, section 65 (Provision of roll information to prescribed authorities)—
 - (a) the chief health officer is a prescribed authority; and
 - (b) assisting the chief health officer to maintain the cancer register under the *Public Health Regulations 2000*, regulation 46 is a prescribed purpose.
- (2) The chief health officer may give roll information to another person or entity if the only use of the information authorised by the chief health officer is to assist the chief health officer to maintain the cancer register.
- (3) A person or entity given roll information by the chief health officer may only use the information to assist the chief health officer to maintain the cancer register.
- (4) In this regulation:

roll information means a copy of a roll or of information contained on a roll.

5 Prescribed entity—Act, s 67 (1) (b)

The ActewAGL retail partnership ABN 46 221 314 841 (Actew Retail Ltd ABN 23 074 371 207 and AGL ACT Retail Investments Pty Ltd ABN 53 093 631 586) is prescribed.

5A Declaration ballot papers

The heading to be printed or endorsed on a ballot paper to be used for declaration voting shall be the heading to a ballot paper set out in the Act, schedule 1 modified by inserting **Declaration** above **Ballot paper**.

6 Prescribed classes of items—Act, s 295 (d)

- (1) The following classes of items are prescribed:
 - (a) letters from an MLA which include the name of the MLA and an indication that he or she is an MLA;
 - (b) press releases published by or on behalf of an MLA which include the name of the MLA and an indication that he or she is an MLA.
 - (c) reports under the *Annual Reports (Government Agencies) Act 1995*;
 - (d) subject to subregulation (2), publications of a government agency that include—
 - (i) the name of the agency; and
 - (ii) the City of Canberra Arms; and
 - (iii) the words ‘Australian Capital Territory’, ‘Australian Capital Territory Legislative Assembly’, ‘ACT Legislative Assembly’, ‘Australian Capital Territory Government’ or ‘ACT Government’.
- (2) In subregulation (1) (d):

publication does not include a publication that is published for the first time within 6 months before a general election if the publication includes a picture of an MLA.

1 About the endnotes

Amending and modifying laws are annotated in the legislation history and the amendment history. Current modifications are not included in the republished law but are set out in the endnotes.

Not all editorial amendments made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 are annotated in the amendment history. Full details of any amendments can be obtained from the Parliamentary Counsel's Office.

Uncommenced amending laws and expiries are listed in the legislation history and the amendment history. These details are underlined. Uncommenced provisions and amendments are not included in the republished law but are set out in the last endnote.

If all the provisions of the law have been renumbered, a table of renumbered provisions gives details of previous and current numbering.

The endnotes also include a table of earlier republications.

If the republished law includes penalties, current information about penalty unit values appears on the republication inside front cover.
